PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to submit the Ballarat Cricket Association (BCA) Presidents Report for season 2021/22 on behalf of the entire Board of Directors of the BCA which continued to serve the Association over the past season.

Firstly, I would like to thank Past President, Mr. Rob Florence, for his 7 years of service as President of the Ballarat Cricket Association.

For the first time in many years, we have had a full complement of Directors, and I am very pleased to have two female Directors appointed to the Board – Victoria Kennedy and Sara Warren. Both brought a wealth of senior management and sporting experience to the Board.

With the resignation of BCA Operations Officer, Mr. Greg Wakeling, the Board appointed a new Operations Officer in Ms. Jenna Fowlie to the position. Jenna came to us with a strong background in cricket and cricket administration and I am proud to say that she has proven the appointment a success.

I would like to personally thank Jenna for all the work she has done throughout this season, likewise I would extend thanks to Greg for his work through the previous 7 years.

As with the previous season, the backdrop of this season has been Covid and its impact. Keeping the season on track presented challenges and the leadership shown by the Board and Executive of Clubs ensured the challenges were overcome, I would like to extend my thanks to each of you.

I wish to acknowledge and thank our sponsors for the past season – Alfredton Dental, Kookaburra, Interpath, Florence Audit and Assurance, Ballarat Ground Works, Waller and Chester, S3 Promotions, and the City of Ballarat.

Many people ask me what has changed in Ballarat cricket since I've been away, and whilst there have been many changes, the most profound is the quality of our grounds and facilities. I wish to thank Mr. Peter LeLievre, Mr. Rob Florence and officers of the Ballarat City Council for their continued work through the City of Ballarat Strategic Partnership – this includes –

- Opening of the new turf wicket at Buninyong.
- The Victoria Park project.
- The Wendouree West project.
- Refurbishment of Alfredton No 2.
- New practice facilities at Alfredton, Russell Square and Doug Dean Reserve Delacombe.

Without doubt the most significant key deliverable from the Strategic Partnership has been the transfer of responsibility for the maintenance and preparation of turf wickets from City of Ballarat staff to curators employed by the Club. Without doubt some of our grounds are now comparable to some of the best in regional Victoria – I especially want to thank each of the Club curators for their ongoing support. I would also like to thank Mr. Rob Florence, Mr. John Penhall, Buninyong CC and Federation University for their assistance in the development of two synthetic pitches at the Mt Helen campus.

The BCA Board recognises to have a successful female competition we must create pathways for success starting from Master Blaster all the way to having a successful Senior Women's competition. There have been many foundation stones laid this year –

- The BCA Board released its Female Pathways document – this document outlines the goals and timeframes for a fully affiliated female competition.
- Formalisation of BCA Women's Subcommittee.
- Recognition of Women's contribution to the game through the awarding of both Junior and Senior Women's Cricketer of the year's awards.
- Sanctioning an all-women's Senior Competition, with teams representing Ballarat Redan, Buninyong and Mt Clear (x2), playing a round robin competition under lights at the Alfredton complex for premiership points with Ballarat Redan becoming the inaugural Premiers.

My thanks go out to Mrs. Victoria Kennedy and Ms. Jenna Fowlie and all of those involved in the promotion of Women's Cricket in Ballarat.

A major focus of the Board this year has been the state of the game and working in the space of responsibilities and respect. Members of the BCA Board have worked tirelessly with Clubs, players, and umpires to ensure that our game is played within the "Spirit of the Game", I would like to personally thank all those involved. I believe from this view point our game is in a better place.

The other major body of work has been the review of all the documents governing our game, all the policies, procedures, by-laws, and rules of the game have undertaken an extensive review – thanks go out to Mr. Peter LeLievre and Mrs. Victoria Kennedy for their work.

Whilst individual recognition can be found within the body of this report, I would extend my congratulations to all Clubs, teams, players, and members for a successful season.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards including applicable Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The financial report is for Ballarat Cricket Association as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Ballarat Cricket Association is a company limited by guarantee.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

Reporting Basis and Conventions

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

(a) *Property, Plant and Equipment*

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost less any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The depreciation rate used for plant and equipment ranges from 5.00% to 33.3%.

(b) *Buildings*

The Eastern Oval administration building is brought to account at cost less accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The depreciation rate used for the building is 2.5%.

(c) *Income Tax*

The company is exempt from income tax pursuant to Section 23(g)(iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936.

(d) *Expenditure on Wickets*

The costs of improvements to wickets and preparation of new turf wickets are treated as period costs and included in the determination of the trading results of the company where those assets are not directly owned by the company.

Notes To and Forming Part of the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 June 2022

(e) *Financial Instruments*

Credit Risk

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at balance date to recognised financial assets is the carrying amount, net of any provisions for doubtful debts, as disclosed in the balance sheet and notes to the financial report. The association does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor under financial instruments entered into by the association.

Net Fair Values

- (i) Financial assets where the carrying amount exceeds net fair values have not been written down as the association intends to hold these assets to maturity. Conversely, where the carrying amount is less than the net fair values, such financial assets have not been written up.
- (ii) No financial assets and financial liabilities are readily traded on organised markets in standardised form.
- (iii) For other assets and other liabilities the net fair value approximates their carrying value.

(f) *Goods and Services Tax (GST)*

The company is required to be registered for GST therefore GST is collected on income earned by the company, and GST credits are claimed on expenses paid.

(g) *St Patrick's Turf Wicket Contribution*

On 1 October 2005 an agreement was entered into with St Patrick's College to have non-exclusive use of the Hill Oval. The agreement is for 5 years with three 5 year options. All options have been exercised and the agreement continues. In return, 50% of the turf wicket installations and 50% of the watering system costs were contributed. This is to be amortised over the 20 years of the agreement.
