## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to submit the Ballarat Cricket Association (BCA) President's Report for season 2020/21 on behalf of the entire Board of Directors of the BCA which has continued to serve the Association over the last season.

A review of the 2020/21 season indicates a year that was shadowed by the dark cloud covering our whole community - Covid-19. This backdrop saw the BCA conduct a season made up entirely of One-day games. The decision to conduct such a season was based on relevant advice and recommendations from Cricket Victoria and Cricket Australia together with the support of our Association Clubs and the aim to achieve as full a season as possible amidst the possibilities of lockdowns caused by the pandemic. Looking back, we can now note how fortunate we were to only miss one Saturday of cricket due to a Covid lockdown but as we have seen throughout the winter sports season the risk of missing weekends of sport still exists. The pandemic continues to plague our country and the world even at the time of preparing this Report and there remains a possibility that it will impact the playing of our game for some time to come.

All Clubs and players are to be commended on their compliance with relevant Covid-19 restrictions and protocols through last season. They impacted training sessions and playing days, and at times probably seemed extreme, but in the end such compliance enabled all to continue to play the game we had all strived for. All games played remained competitive with several outstanding performances throughout the year, but it hoped that all players gained enjoyment from participating in our sport during a period where there were many external pressures involved in life.

I wish to acknowledge and thank our major sponsors for the past season – Alfredton Dental, Kookaburra, Waller & Chester, Florence Audit & Assurance, S3 Promotions and Rebel Sport. Their on-going support of our Association in Ballarat is much appreciated. Thank you also to the other supporting sponsors who have contributed during the year. Recognition of Premiers, Representative teams and players, and Individual award winners appears within this Annual Report document. Congratulations are extended to the Premiers in each Grade.

Congratulations and thank you to our Junior players – male and female – who have represented our Association during the past season in a number of competitions throughout the region and state. Senior representative cricket did not eventuate in 2020/21

From an individual player point of view, again recognition is noted elsewhere in this Annual Report, but special congratulations go to our Cleary Medal winner in our 1<sup>st</sup> Grade competition – Sam Miller (Wendouree CC). Similar congratulations go to Lachlan Snaith (Ballan CC) for his success in winning the Bernie Davey Medal in the 2nd Grade competition. Congratulations also to Sam Miller, Josh White and Jacob Smith on their selection in the 2020/21 VCCL Team of the Year.

In a general sense, I would like to convey my sincere thanks to the executives, committees, and players at all Clubs for their general spirit of co-operation and involvement in the Association. Special co-operation has been required throughout the 2020/21 season with the adherence to Covid-19 Playing

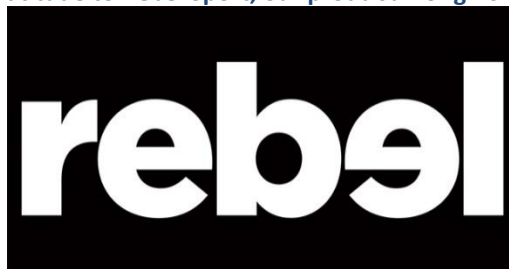

**1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards including applicable Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The financial report is for Ballarat Cricket Association as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Ballarat Cricket Association is a company limited by guarantee.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

**Basis of Preparation**

*Reporting Basis and Conventions*

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

(a) *Property, Plant and Equipment*

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost less any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The depreciation rate used for plant and equipment ranges from 5.00% to 33.3%.

(b) *Buildings*

The Eastern Oval administration building is brought to account at cost less accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The depreciation rate used for the building is 2.5%.

(c) *Income Tax*

The company is exempt from income tax pursuant to Section 23(g)(iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936.

(d) *Expenditure on Wickets*

The costs of improvements to wickets and preparation of new turf wickets are treated as period costs and included in the determination of the trading results of the company where those assets are not directly owned by the company.

For the Year Ended 30 June 2021**

(e) *Financial Instruments*

**Credit Risk**

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at balance date to recognised financial assets is the carrying amount, net of any provisions for doubtful debts, as disclosed in the balance sheet and notes to the financial report. The association does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor under financial instruments entered into by the association.

**Net Fair Values**

- (i) Financial assets where the carrying amount exceeds net fair values have not been written down as the association intends to hold these assets to maturity. Conversely, where the carrying amount is less than the net fair values, such financial assets have not been written up.
- (ii) No financial assets and financial liabilities are readily traded on organised markets in standardised form.
- (iii) For other assets and other liabilities the net fair value approximates their carrying value.

(f) *Goods and Services Tax (GST)*

The company is required to be registered for GST therefore GST is collected on income earned by the company, and GST credits are claimed on expenses paid.

(g) *St Patrick's Turf Wicket Contributions*

On 1 October 2005 an agreement was entered into with St Patricks College to have non-exclusive use of the Hill Oval. The agreement is for 5 years with three 5 year options. All options have been exercised and the agreement continues. In return, 50% of the turf wicket installations and 50% of the watering system costs were contributed. This is to be amortised over the 20 years of the agreement.
