PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to submit the Ballarat Cricket Association (BCA) President's Report for season 2019/20 on behalf of the entire Board of Directors of the BCA which has continued to serve the Association over the last season.

Unfortunately, a review of the 2019/20 season seems to concentrate on the fact that the season concluded under strange and unprecedented circumstances. It has been well documented and recognised that the Board had to make the difficult and unenviable decision – criticised by some, applauded by others - to cease our season prior to the playing of Grand Finals in all grades due to the outbreak and growth of the Coronavirus pandemic. The world was turned upside down at that stage and whilst being very difficult for the BCA at season end, the BCA has proven to be only a very minor entity affected by this insidious wide-spread virus. The pandemic continues to plague our country and the world even at the time of preparing this report and there is every indication it will impact the playing of our game for some time to come.

Whilst the Coronavirus pandemic decimated the conclusion of our season, the times throughout the season were impacted by a variety of factors – rain causing washouts; extreme heat requiring constant monitoring; and for the first time, air quality again requiring constant monitoring. We seemed to have faced it all from a climatic point of view during the season and then finally were faced with the community-wide health crisis that finished our season. Throughout all that we faced during the season, it is evident that strong and competitive cricket was played and it is hoped that everyone involved enjoyed the season that was.

I wish to acknowledge and thank our major sponsors for the past season — Alfredton Dental, Kookaburra, Major League, Waller & Chester, Bendigo Bank, and Rebel Sport. Their on-going support of our Association in Ballarat is much appreciated. Thank you also to the other supporting sponsors who have contributed during the year. Sourcing of new sponsorship for the future will continue to remain a focus of the Board.

Recognition of Premiers, Representative teams and players, and Individual award winners appears within this Annual Report document. Congratulations are extended to the Premiers in each Grade. Whilst the premierships were awarded under unusual circumstances at season end, our usual criteria were followed to award the highest ranked team at the stage the finals program was at in each Grade.

Congratulations and thank you to players – senior and junior, male and female – who have represented our Association during the past season in a number of competitions throughout the region, state, and in some cases nationally.

From an individual player point of view, again recognition is noted elsewhere in this Annual Report but special congratulations go to our joint winners of the Cleary Medal in our 1st Grade competition – Cole Roscholler (Wendouree CC) and Sam Burgess (Ballarat Redan CC). Similar congratulations go to Brad Dunbar (Coronet City CC) for his success in winning the Bernie Davey Medal in the 2nd Grade competition.

In a general sense, I would like to convey my sincere thanks to the executives, committees and players at all Clubs for their general spirit of co-operation and involvement in the Association. Special support will be required throughout the 2020/21 season with the adherence to Covid-19 Playing Conditions and protocols, and also the Child Safety Framework requirements as particular focus, but the Board is confident that Clubs will ensure compliance and support in meeting the requirements.

In concluding my Report, I would like to thank some people and Committees. Thank you to my fellow Board members for their support, assistance and contributions to the BCA during the past season. As Board members we have continued in our efforts to strive for what is in the best interests for cricket in Ballarat and surrounds, and despite some often unwarranted opinions of otherwise, the Board members have continued to retain the drive to pursue our Association's objectives and goals. So, to my fellow Board members – Nathan Yates, James Edmends, Mark Harris and Ron Bedford, Peter Le Lievre and Peter Brady – a sincere thank you for your contributions during this past year and for the support and assistance we have provided each other during the year.

Thank you also to the members of the BCA Pennant committee for their tireless work during the season. This Committee members really have been committed to their task of ensuring the running of our competitions is in accordance with our rules and policies. Thank you, gentlemen, and the Board looks forward to your contributions again in our new season.

The Board of Directors saw it as appropriate to form a Junior Cricket Committee at the commencement of the 2019/20 season, and I would like to initially thank Ron Jennings for him agreeing to Chair that Committee and also David Dawson for his role as Secretary to the Committee. The Committee first and foremost fulfilled its role of providing a forum for Club Junior Co-ordinators to provide feedback and work through matters such as Junior rules and formats. Thank you to all involved.

Thank you to the Ballarat Cricket Umpires Association for its continued support of Ballarat cricket. We wish it success in its aim to increase the number of umpires available to undertake what is sometimes seen to be an unenviable role in our great game. Support and respect for each other will assist in attracting new umpires, and as such benefit our Association. Thank you BCUA members.

I would like to acknowledge the work that our Operations Officer, Greg Wakeling, has done for our Association during the past season. Waka is very passionate about the operations throughout the whole Association, with senior, junior and female cricket activities. He works tirelessly to assist in developing and introducing programs for our juniors - males and females. He has continued to be passionate about his role in acting in the best interests of the Association, assisting the Board to achieve its goals and is irreplaceable.

Best wishes to all Clubs for the new season as different it is going to be at the outset. We will all be required to work together, perhaps even more so, during the upcoming season to enjoy our game but at the same time ensure the health and well-being of all. The Board looks forward to continuing our work for and with all Clubs. We look forward to the ongoing support from all Clubs.

PENNANT COMMITTEE REPORT

Members of the Pennant Committee:

Mark Harris (Chairperson), Paul Hayes, Wayne Hinchcliffe, Peter Mackay and David Thompson. Administrative Support – Greg Wakeling.

The Pennant Committee has met regularly during the season. (16 meetings including the last meeting, which was devoted to a comprehensive review of the season with suggested changes to any rules and policies.)

Season Achievements:

The Pennant Committee has worked extremely hard to ensure a consistent and evidence-based decision-making process has been followed allowing for variations in rules etc. It has been the objective of the committee to ensure that as many games as possible were played on turf wickets in the 1st and 2nd XI competitions. Most rounds have seen all games in both grades playing on turf despite the challenges of reduced grounds being available due to upgrade works being performed at the Mt Clear Oval and festivals and other City of Ballarat functions taking up some grounds during the year. We had the Buninyong CC enter the 1st XI competition and in their first year make a significant run for a birth in the finals in their first year.

The biggest challenge still remains the need for clubs to be compliant with the requirements of the Association. With this in mind we will have a large focus on compliance next season which will see the reinstatement of the fines system for clubs not following the requirements of the BCA including Umpire reports and the maintenance of other important documentation.

This season seen the first ever complaint of vilification. After an extensive investigation and a sensible outcome was achieved the Pennant Committee created a new vilification policy that will be included in the BCA Rules and Policies moving forward. This has been an exhaustive process with advice taken from many different sports and associations and the work of the Pennant Committee should be commended.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the 1 huge effect on the 19/20 season. Covid-19 seen the premature end to the season and has had a significant effect on the off season and will definitely affect the processes and procedures for the 20/21 season. I would like to congratulate the Pennant Committee and the BCA Board for the tireless and stressful hours that they have volunteered to be ahead of the virus and ensure the safety of all participants, officials and supporters has been a priority.

Pitch Preparation:

One of the frustrations over the years has been the inconsistent standard of wickets from one week to the next. This season has seen a marked improvement in the preparation of pitches and is a great lead into the 20/21 season where more changes will be seen. More to follow on this front.

Association Draws:

This year clubs were once again able to nominate the number of teams they wished to compete in the BCA and were also given the extra responsibility of nominating where their teams should play.

This season, members of the Pennant Committee have encouraged feedback from clubs, players and officials concerning any issues they have or want clarification on. This has given clubs more access to PC members and we believe is a positive for the competition when approached in the right way. I am sure the clubs have appreciated the ability to get speedy responses to the queries.

Appeals:

This season saw no appeals for clearances with the new process and guidelines around granting clearances. As always, the Committee is available to step in and adjudicate where required.

Tribunal Hearings:

The Tribunal convened on several occasions for player reports. We also had 1 Automatic penalty given due to exceeding cautions within a 2 year period and 1 instance of a suspended sentence being activated. I believe players were given a fair hearing and penalties suited the offences committed.

Season 2020/21 will see a new Code of Behaviour Policy introduced that will provide clear and definitive expectations on behaviour along with set guidelines for penalties. It will be extensive and remove any processing shortfalls which will assist umpires and players fully understand their expectations.

Meetings with Umpires:

During the 2019/20 season a member of the Pennant Committee has been liaising with the Ballarat Cricket Association Umpire's Association on a regular basis to seek issues which may be causing them concern. The biggest concerns the umpires have going forward is with their numbers and also player behaviour and dissent. The Code of Conduct implemented last year has seen some much-needed improvement in player behaviour however there is still a long way to go. The umpires have struggled in recent seasons for numbers as everyone is aware. A lot of work has been going on in the off season and this year the numbers will continue to increase. Winter classes were held for all umpires during pre-season and will continue again this season. There has also been a lot of time spent reviewing the reporting process and player behaviour and next season will again see an increased focus and a zero tolerance on poor behaviour. There will be a lot more to come on the Pennant Committee's review and processes moving into season 20/21.

As part of our Review Meeting at the end of the season, the umpires provided a list of suggested rule changes for us to consider. This level of support must be maintained to ensure we are all reading from the same book.

In concluding, I would like to thank all members of the Pennant Committee for their commitment and support of cricket across Ballarat over the past twelve months in a challenging period. I would also like to acknowledge Greg's role in assisting us with administrative support and ensuring we received any correspondence immediately he received it. His assistance with historic information and record keeping is greatly appreciated.

The Ballarat Cricket Association senior representative program was an overall success for season 2019/20. As a sign of things to come, our first match in the Kenmac Shield was washed out halfway through our innings at 4/85 chasing Castlemaine's total of 179.

The second match of the Kenmac Shield eventuated into a final against Bendigo after they defeated Gisborne. As a great hit out before MCW, Bendigo put 185 on the Board for us to chase down. 2 early wickets saw us 2/20 with Harry Killoran and Nathan Yates steadying the ship until Killoran fell with the score 77. Fellow Englishman Sam Burgess came and went swiftly which brought seasoned campaigner, Heath Pyke, strolling to the crease with his usual swagger. From there it was all Ballarat with Yates finishing unbeaten on 100 and Pyke on 54 to take the victory.

Melbourne Country Week started off not in Melbourne at all with an ultra-rare genuine home match for us against the heavy favourites Geelong. Winning the toss, Geelong skipper Sean O'Neill would have been very pleased with himself having Sam Miller walking back to the shed after providing the cordon with some catching practice. The smile was soon wiped off and turned into a frown when the next wicket fell at 109 with Leigh Lorenzen and Harry Killoran again steadying the innings before he fell for 35.

Nathan Yates and Jarrod Burns came in and did 'run a ball' jobs at their respective ends, but it was Lorenzen who kicked into top gear slaying the bowlers all over the park finishing on 174 from 138 balls with 16 fours and 8 sixes to put a hefty 321 on the board. This score is a BCA record since the limited overs matches were introduced in the 70's. A feat that may never be toppled.

McCafferty and Priyankara struck the early blows with Geelong reeling at 3/11 and despite some resistance from the middle order which included everyone's favourite former BCA player, Ryan Gibson, they were never really in the hunt with the slow bowlers doing the rest of the damage to see them fall 97 runs short.

Unfortunately, that where most of the positives ended for the teams quest. Rain forced the round 2 match against Sale-Maffra to be abandoned 31 overs in for no result, rain saw no play possible in Round 3 against West Gippsland, rain saw no play in the Semi Final scheduled against Ferntree Gully and in an unprecedented turn of events the BCA were awarded the 'win' on the back of just 1 match and promoted to the Provincial final on the Friday v Bendigo.

Batting first in the final saw another shaky start with Sam Miller and Harry Killoran falling with just 2 runs on the board. Leigh Lorenzen did his best to resurrect things with a very hard fought 36 and along with Nathan Yates and Jarrod Burns got the score to 83 before he fell in a horrible mix up. Burns continued to keep the scoreboard ticking over amassing 75 valuable runs with some solid contribution from Heath Pyke and Sam Burgess in the middle order and the score after 50 overs was a modest 219.

It wouldn't be unfair to say Bendigo were in a hurry to get the job done and the bowling assisted that desire with the total chased down in an impressive 38.2 over to see Bendigo crowned Provincial Premiers for season 2019/20. We will remain in the Provincial division for another year and fingers crossed do get the chance to participate in MCW 2020/2021.

All players who represented the BCA conducted themselves respectfully and very well within the spirit of the game and we wholly thank them for their efforts.

Many thanks must go out to the selection panel, MC Physio, Team Manager Darren Woodyatt and Scorer Stuart Lacy for their organisation and contributions to all representative cricket in season 2019/20 but especially for this week-long tournament that involved much more off-field activity than on-field.

The net result of the Association was a profit of \$38,235 (2019: profit \$2,759).

Activities

The principal continuing activities of the company are the promotion, control and administration of the game of cricket and encouragement of social interaction between members of the association.

Dividends Paid or Recommended

The company is prohibited, pursuant to its Constitution, from paying dividends to its members. Accordingly, no dividend has been paid by the company during the year and no dividend is proposed to be paid to the members.

Review of Operations

The year has built upon the success of previous years, with thanks to the support of our sponsors but increased expenditure on necessary synthetic wicket replacements has contributed largely to the loss incurred for the year

Significant Changes

No significant changes have occurred in the state of affairs of the company during the year.

Matters Subsequent to the End of the Financial Year

The impact of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is ongoing and while it has been financially positive for the association up to 30 June 2020, it is not practicable to estimate the potential impact, positive or negative, after the reporting date. The situation is rapidly developing and is dependent on measures imposed by the Australian Government and other countries, such as maintaining social distancing requirements, quarantine, travel restrictions and any economic stimulus that may be provided.

No other matter or circumstance has arisen since 30 June 2020 that has significantly affected, or may significantly affect the association's operations, the results of those operations, or the association's state of affairs in future financial years.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards including applicable Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The financial report is for Ballarat Cricket Association as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Ballarat Cricket Association is a company limited by guarantee.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of Preparation

Reporting Basis and Conventions

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost less any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The depreciation rate used for plant and equipment ranges from 5.00% to 33.3%.

(b) Buildings

The Eastern Oval administration building is brought to account at cost less accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The depreciation rate used for the building is 2.5%.

(c) Income Tax

The company is exempt from income tax pursuant to Section 23(g)(iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936.

(d) Expenditure on Wickets

The costs of improvements to wickets and preparation of new turf wickets are treated as period costs and included in the determination of the trading results of the company where those assets are not directly owned by the company.

(e) Financial Instruments

Credit Risk

The maximum exposure to credit risk, excluding the value of any collateral or other security, at balance date to recognised financial assets is the carrying amount, net of any provisions for doubtful debts, as disclosed in the balance sheet and notes to the financial report. The association does not have any material credit risk exposure to any single debtor under financial instruments entered into by the association.

Net Fair Values

- (i) Financial assets where the carrying amount exceeds net fair values have not been written down as the association intends to hold these assets to maturity. Conversely, where the carrying amount is less than the net fair values, such financial assets have not been written up.
- (ii) No financial assets and financial liabilities are readily traded on organised markets in standardised form.
- (iii) For other assets and other liabilities the net fair value approximates their carrying value.

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The company is not required to be registered for GST therefore no GST is collected on income earned by the company, and GST credits are not claimed on expenses paid.

(g) Prepayments

On 1 October 2005 an agreement was entered into with St Patricks College to have non-exclusive use of the Hill Oval. The agreement is for 5 years with three 5 year options. In return, 50% of the turf wicket installations and 50% of the watering system costs were contributed. This is to be amortised over the 20 years of the agreement.
